## Colonel Clark Benton Dorsey WICC Founder and first chairman of the Wetumpka Impact Crater Commission

Colonel Clark Benton Dorsey, USAF, Retired, was born in Jonesboro, Georgia and began elementary school in the Fayetteville, Georgia public school in September 1944. Six weeks later his family moved to Marietta, Georgia.

Clark lettered on the football team and graduated from Marietta High School in 1956. After graduating on a Friday in June, he began work on Monday at Lockheed Georgia as a Georgia Tech co-operative student and served in the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps for five years.

In 1961Clark graduated from the Georgia Institute of Technology and the same year was commissioned a second lieutenant and entered active duty. In 1969 Clark received a Master's degree in Business Administration from Ohio State University. He served 30 years as a USAF communications-electronics officer and software acquisition program manager. He also commanded units in California, Turkey and Germany; served overseas tours in Turkey (2), Germany (2) and Viet Nam (1) and had stateside assignments in Georgia (2), Mississippi (2), Maine, Ohio (2), Illinois, California, and Alabama.

Since retiring from the Air Force (Gunter Annex, Alabama) in 1992 Clark served as the first Executive Director of the Montgomery Habitat for Humanity affiliate and as Record Services Director at the Alabama Department of Public Health.

After full retirement in 1999, he travelled extensively in Europe, the U.S., and central and south America.

Clark's community service includes:

- Founder and chairman of the Alabama River Region Preservation Trust.
- Founder and first president of the Three Rivers Habitat for Humanity affiliate
- President of the Trail of Legends Association.
